## **FILMS ON STEINWAY**

**"The Camden 28" by Anthony Giacchino**

**Wednesday, June 27<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm**

How far would you go to stop a war? "The Camden 28" recalls a 1971 raid on a Camden, N.J., draft board office by "Catholic Left" activists protesting the Vietnam War and its effects on urban America. Arrested on site in a clearly planned sting, the protesters included four Catholic priests, a Lutheran minister, and 23 others. "The Camden 28" reveals the story behind the arrests, a provocative tale of government intrigue and personal betrayal. Supreme Court Justice William Brennan called the ensuing legal battle "one of the great trials of the 20th century." Thirty-five years later, the participants take stock of the motives, fears, and costs of their activism and its relevance to America today.
